INDEPENDENT RESURVEY OF THE RANGE LINE THROUGH T. 12 S.,
BETWEEN Rs. 69 and 70 E.

Superseding survey executed by W. H. Myrick in 1882.

The initial azimuth for this line is determined by de-
flection from the secant line established during the sur-
vey of the Third Standard Parallel South under Group 178
Nevada. A series of four angles were turned and the
mean value accepted, which was subsequently checked by
solar observation and found to be correct.

Beginning at the standard corner of T. 12 S., Rs. 69 and
70 E., which is an iron post, 3 ins. diam., firmly set,
marked and witnessed as described in the official record,
Book "A" Group 178 Nevada.

North, on true line bet. secs. 31 and 36.

Over rolling country, through medium dense undergrowth;
asc. 45 ft. on SW. slope.

- 9.40 SW. edge of mesa, bears N. 10° W. and S. 10° E.
- 18.19 Road, bears same as mesa.
- 24.90 NE. edge of mesa, bears N. 10° W. and S. 10° E.; desc.
35 ft.
- 38.00 Wash, course S. 10° E.
- 40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 27 ins. in the
ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap mkd.
