

## Subdivision of T. 44 N., R. 58 E.

## Chains

Continue ascent 935 ft. to 82.03 ch. point; over small draws draining SE.

55.00 Slope changes to S.; asc. through dense manzanita.

56.50 Spring bears E. 1 ch.; asc. through scattered mahogany and pine timber.

58.90 at top of spur ridge bearing N.30°E., and S.30°W. Slope changes to SW $\frac{1}{2}$ ; top of prominent rock slide bears W. about  $3\frac{1}{2}$  chs.

79.40 Enter heavy pine timber, bears SE. and NW.

82.03 Intersect the N. bdy. of the Tp.

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 32 ins. in the ground, for closing cor. of secs. 1 and 2, with brass cap mkd.

A three forked pine, 6 ins. diam., bears S. 37° E., 24 lks. dist., mkd. T 44 N R 58 E S 1 C C B T.

A two forked pine, 8 ins. diam., bears S. 22 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° W.,  $5\frac{1}{2}$  lks. dist., mkd. T 44 N R 58 E S 2 C C B T.

From the point of intersection the cor. of secs. 35 and 36, heretofore described, bears East 4.98 chs. dist.

Land, rough mountainous.

Soil, gravelly loam; 3rd rate.

Timber, mahogany, pine and balsam.

Undergrowth, sagebrush, manzanita, deerbrush and grouse brush.

Grazing, fair to good.

From the cor. of secs. 25, 26, 35, and 36.

West, bet. secs. 26 and 35, on temporary governing section line.

40.00 Set temp.  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor.

80.00 Set temp. cor. secs. 26, 27, 34, and 35.

Thence

S. 0° 01' E. on a temporary line, bet. secs. 34 and 35.

40.00 Set temp.  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor.

78.37 Intersect the S. bdy. of the Tp. 6 lks. N. 89°00' E. of the true point for the cor. of secs. 34 and 35, heretofore described.
