A pine, 6 ins. diam., bears S. 82 1/2° W., 21 lks. dist.,  
mkd. 1/4 S12 BT.

A balsam fir, 5 ins. diam., bears N. 55 1/2° W., 32 lks.  
dist., mkd. 1/4 S12 BT.

Asc. 1000 ft. over a broken SE. slope to the ridge.

53.00 Spur, slopes N. 60° E.; continue ascent.

77.24 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 4 ins. in the  
ground to solid rock, over a cross X, and in a mound of  
stone, for witness cor. of secs. 1 and 12 only, with  
brass cap mkd.

Continue ascent.

77.60 Ridge, bears NE. and SW., divide between Cougar and Fall  
Creeks; desc. 160 ft. over precipitous N. slope.

80.00 Point for the cor. of secs. 1 and 12 falls upon steeply  
sloping slide rock, where a permanent monument cannot be  
erected.

Land, rough and broken mountain slopes, general E. expo-  
sure and drainage.  
Soil, shallow rocky loam, 4th rate.  
Timber, pine, fir and mahogany; undergrowth, sagebrush  
and mountain rush. Native grasses.  
Poor grazing.

North, along the E. bdy. of sec. 1.

Over mountainous land, through scattering timber and a  
medium dense undergrowth; desc. 460 ft. over a N. slope.

13.00 Draw, drains NE.; continue descent over rolling land  
sloping NE.

23.50 Fork of Fall Creek, stream of good water, 2 lks. wide and  
2 ins. deep, flowing E.; continue descent.

25.80 Point from which an old log cabin bears East, 70 lks.

38.30 Fork of Fall Creek, 3 lks. wide and 2 ins. deep, flows  
E.; asc. along a SE. slope.

40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 22 ins. in the  
ground to solid rock, and in a mound of stone, for 1/4 sec.  
cor. of sec. 1 only, with brass cap mkd.
