Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 10 ins. in the ground to solid rock, in a mound of stone, for the witness cor. of lots 7 and 8, sec. 31, with brass cap mkd.

raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base, 1½ ft. high, N. of cor.

Point for lot cor., 80.00 chs. westing from cor. of secs. 31 and 32.

This point falls on the face of a ledge bearing NW. and SE. and facing NE., where it would be impracticable to set a permanent monument.

Asc. 320 ft. on a steep NE. slope over a series of broken ledges bearing NW. and SE. and facing NE.

The cor. of Tps. 44 and 45 N., Rs. 59 and 60 E., which is a flat topped basalt stone 20x18 ins. surface and showing 3 ins. above the ground, mkd. with a cross (X) on the top and 6 grooves N., E., S., and W., and witnessed by a mound of stone to the S. Impracticable to reconstruct with 3-in. pipe.

A mahogany, 8 ins. diam., bears S. 70° E., 87 lks. dist., mkd. T44N R60E S6 BT. (Old BT)

A mahogany, 12 ins. diam., bears S. 61½° W., 79 lks. dist., mkd. T44N R59E S1 BT. (Old BT)

A mahogany, 10 ins. diam., the W. limb, 5 ins. diam., bears N. 30¼° W., 87 lks. dist., mkd. T45N R59E S36 BT. (Old BT)

Land, mountainous.

Soil, 1st rate in bottoms, shallow elsewhere.

Undergrowth, sagebrush, grouse brush, deer brush, and manzanita. Bunch grass.

Timber, aspen, cottonwood and mahogany.

Grazing, good to very good.
