

Chains

raise a mound of
stone, 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, W. of cor.

Continue slight desc. along a W. slope.

41.80 Spur, slopes N. from S. 10° E.; desc. 90 ft. on a N. slope on the top of a large spur sloping N.

70.00 N. edge of spur, edge bears E. and W.; desc. 100 ft. on a steeper N. slope.

80.00 Enter heavy aspen growth and dense undergrowth, bears E. and W.; desc. 20 ft. on a N. slope.

80.39 Intersect the S. bdy. of T. 47 N., R. 59 E.

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. diam., 25 ins. in the ground, for the closing cor. of secs. 1 and 2, with brass cap mkd.

An aspen, 7 ins. diam., bears S. 41° E., 51 lks. dist., mkd. T46N R59E S1 C C BT.

An aspen, 7 ins. diam., bears S. 76° W., 99 lks. dist., mkd. T46N R59E S2 C C BT.

This corner is near the south edge of heavy aspen timber.

From this corner, the cor. of secs. 35 and 36, T. 47 N., R. 59 E., which is an iron post, 2 ins. diam., firmly set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the official record, bears S. $89^{\circ}56'$ W., 5.42 chs. dist. I alter the markings by adding S2 T46NR59E to the south half of the brass cap.

Land, rolling benchland.

Soil, shallow sandy loam surface, 3rd rate.

Timber, aspen and mahogany; undergrowth, sagebrush, buckbrush, grouse brush and bunch grass.

Grazing, fair to good.

From the cor. of secs. 34 and 35, T. 46 N., R. 59 E., on the S. bdy. of the Tp. hereinbefore described,

N. $0^{\circ}02'$ W., bet. secs. 34 and 35,

Over rough mountainous country; desc. 40 ft. along an E. slope through scattered timber and dense undergrowth.

7.00 Spur, slopes NE.; desc. 10 ft.

8.00 Outcrop, 30 ft. high, faces NW. and bears NE. about 50 lks. from SW.; desc. 140 ft. on a steep N. slope over rough and broken outcrops.

13.30 Ledge, 50 ft. high, faces N. and bears E. and W. about 1 ch.; enter heavy balsam and pine timber at 15.00 ch. pt.; desc. 340 ft. on a steep N. slope through dense timber.
