

Retracement of a Portion of the South Boundary of T. 5 N., R. 66 E.

Chains.

From the $\frac{1}{4}$ cor. of secs. 5 and 32, on the S. bdy. of T. 5 N., R. 66 E., hereinafter described.

West on a retracement line bet. secs. 5 and 32, along S. bdy. of T. 5 N., R. 66 E.

40.00 Unable to find any evidence of cor. of secs. 5, 6, 31 and 32, after diligent search.

Blank Line along a Portion of S. Bdy. of T. 5 N., R. 66 E.

From the $\frac{1}{4}$ cor. of secs. 5 and 32, on the S. bdy. of T. 5 N., R. 66 E., which is a badly decayed cedar stake, 2 ins. sq., $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. long, lying on top of ground, and faintly marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S on one face. Reestablish this cor. at the same point by setting the stake 18 ins. in the ground beside an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. in dia., 10 ins. in the ground to solid rock and in a mound of stone for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap mkd:

West on a blank line along the S. bdy. of T. 5 N., R. 66 E.
