GENERAL DESCRIPTION

Practiaally all the lands in T.6 S. R.66 E., are generally mountainous in character, many portions being rugged and precipitous. Some arable land is found in the extreme eastern portion of the township along the bottom land contiguous to the creek. The land in NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of sec 2, settled by Mr. ^{James} W. C. McGuffie, is the only cultivated area in the entire township. He has a small productive orchard, and alfalfa fields with a total acreage of about 30 acres, all of which is subject to irrigation. The uplands in the higher portions of the township are suitable only for grazing, there being no timber of commercial value.

The soil is generally a coarse gravelly sandy loam, containing much sandstone, and numerous outcroppings of a conglomerate formation. Along the left bank of the main creek ^{are} found desposits of Kaolin, which are now being prospected for the purpose of mining.

The general drainage of the township is southeasterly. The Meadow Valley Wash enters the township on the N.bdy of sec. 2, and flows in a southeasterly course, leaving the township on the S.bdy of sec. 36.

The Los Angeles and Salt Lake Railroad traverses the township, following the general course of the left bank of the Meadow Valley Wash.

Elgin Nev., a town of 30 population, on the L.A.&S.L.R.R. is located about 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ mile from the S.bdy. of the township.
