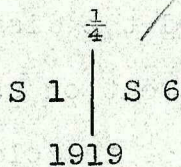


Retracement of a Portion of the South Bdy. of T. 7 S., R. 67 E. 15.

Chains.

36.10 Bottom of canyon, 30 ft. below top of spur, course SW.;
asc. over volcanic outcroppings.

40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. in dia., 26 ins. in
the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap mkd:



and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high,
W. of cor.

This cor. is located 50 ft. above bottom of canyon.

49.10 Top of spur, 320 ft. above $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., projects SW.;
desc. Leave volcanic outcroppings.

53.90 Bottom of ravine, 40 ft. below top of spur, course SW.;
asc.

69.40 Top of spur, 270 ft. above bottom of ravine, projects W.;
desc.

70.34 The cor. of Tps. 6 and 7 S., Rs. 66 and 67 E., hereinbe-
fore described, 10 ft. below top of spur.

Land; rough mountainous with outcroppings of trachyte
and granite formation.

Soil; loose, rocky and gravelly, red sand a few ins. deep
to bed-rock.

Undergrowth; dense sagebrush and black brush, scattering
oose, cactus and mountain rush.

General exposure and drainage, westerly.

Scattering growth of bunch grass.

No timber.
