Land; steep and rough mountainous, with general drainage
to the SE.

Soil; rocky, red sand, very shallow on ridges and spurs;
but varies from a few ins. to 1 ft. deep in the bottoms
of ravines.

Undergrowth; scattering black brush, sagebrush, patches
of oak brush and manzanita.

Timber; heavy cedar and pinon pine.

Formation; outcroppings of broken volcanic ledges, bould-
ers and slide-rock.

NE. and SW. exposure.

Very little grass.

through heavy pinon pine and cedar, dense oak brush and
