General Description.

Nearly all of this township is situated on the west slope of a range of mountains lying between Utah and Nevada, and contains every variety of land from level and rolling to steep and rough mountains; and has an altitude varying from approximately six thousand five hundred feet in the lower sections to about eight thousand feet in the higher portions. The surface is cut by numerous draws, ravines, hollows and gulches, which connect with two main canyons known as Deer Lodge and Service-berry, the former draining almost the entire south two-thirds of the township and the latter the remaining northern portion. These two canyons have a general southwest course into the Meadow Valley Wash which flows through Township One North Range Sixty-Nine East. The only permanent water in the township is found in these canyons, and the streams become very small and almost dry up late in the summer. Other creeks are surface water and flow only early in the spring of the year while the snow is on the ground.
