


South Boundary of T. 1 N., R. 71 E.

Chains

pine post, 6 ins. sq., extending $2\frac{1}{2}$ ft. above ground, firmly set and marked UTAH on E., NEVADA on W., L W 37 on S. and 231 on N. faces. Reestablish this cor. at the same point by setting beside the wooden stake an iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. dia., 24 ins. in the ground for the 231st. mile cor., with brass cap mkd:



and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, N. of cor. No bearing trees available.

Land; steep mountains with porphyry formation exposed in the form of slide-rock and outcroppings.

Soil; rocky, dark loam, varying in depth from a few ins. to 3 ft., lying on a light or a brown clay about 6 ins. to 2 ft. deep to bed-rock.

Timber; cedar, pinon pine, mahogany and aspen.

Undergrowth; scattering to a dense growth of sagebrush; patches of rosebushes, deer browse, service-berry bushes, young aspen and mahogany.

Eastern exposure, S. 35.60 chs.; remainder of mile exposed to the N.

General drainage E. Fair grazing.

From the standard cor. of Tps. 1 N., Rs. 70 and 71 E., on the Mount Diablo Base Line, heretofore described, East on a true line on the S. bdy. of sec. 31, T. 1 N., R. 71 E., along the Mount Diablo Base Line.

Over rolling mountainous land, through heavy cedar, pinon pine and scattering sagebrush; desc. 145 ft.

10.60 Hollow, course S.10°W.; asc.

10.80 Leave heavy timber, bears N. and S., and enter dense sagebrush.

19.10 Enter heavy timber, bearing N. and S., on top of spur,
