

Retracement of the North boundary of T. 17 N., R 61 E.

Chains

West, on the north boundary of sec. 1.

40.00 No trace of the original  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor., bet. secs. 1 and 36, after diligent search.

80.00 No trace of the original cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36 after diligent search.

As no subdivisions are dependent on this line; T. 18 N., and T 17 N., R. 61 East, not being surveyed, I abandon further search.

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Resurvey of a portion of the south boundary of sec. 31, T. 18 N., R. 63 E.

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The corner of Ts. 17 and 18 N., Rs. 62 and 63 East, is a wooden post, 4 ft. long, 4 ins. in dia., marked and witnessed as described by the surveyor general. This cor. will now refer to Ts. 17 N., Rs. 62 and 63 E., only, therefore I perpetuate it as follows; alongside,

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. in dia., 24 ins. in ground, for cor. of Ts. 17 N., Rs. 62 and 63 East, with brass cap marked,
