Soil, 3rd rate, rocky.

Timber, pine and juniper.

Undergrowth. Low sage.

N. $89^{\circ}18'$ W., on the south boundary of sec. 31.

Over rolling land, covered with low sage brush.

20.35 The original $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., bet. secs. 6 and 31, which is a granite, $10 \times 13 \times 12$ ins., marked and witnessed as described by the surveyor-general. This cor. will now refer to sec. 6 only. I perpetuate it as follows,
Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. in dia., 26 ins. in ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap marked,
