
Chains

South, on true line bet. secs. 31 and 36.

Over rolling land, thru dense junipers.

38.80 Old road, bears E. and W.

40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. in dia., 26 ins. in ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. with brass cap marked,



1918; from which,

A juniper, 20 ins. in dia., bears S.15°E., 88 lks. dist., marked, $\frac{1}{4}$ S 31 BT



A juniper, 11 ins. in dia., bears S.40°W., 132 lks. dist., marked, $\frac{1}{4}$ S 36 BT

46.40 Drain, course SE.

92.81 Intersect the North boundary of sec. 1, T. 17 N., R. 61 E., at a point, West, 18.08 chs. from the re-established cor. of Ts. 17 N., Rs. 61 and 62 E., previously described.

At the point of intersection,

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. in dia., 24 ins. in ground, for cor. of Ts. 18 N., Rs. 61 and 62 E., only, with brass cap marked,

A juniper, 10 ins. in dia., bears N.61 $\frac{1}{2}$ °E., 67 lks. dist., marked, T. 18 N. R 62 E S 31 BT

A juniper, 8 ins. in dia., bears N.29 $\frac{1}{2}$ °W., 154 lks. dist., marked, T 18 N R 61 E S 36 BT

Land, rolling

Soil, 3rd rate, gravel wash.

Timber, dense juniper. Undergrowth, low sage brush.
