


Survey of the Third Standard Parallel North

marked, T 16 N R 69 E S 31 BT SC

A mountain mahogany, 7 ins. in dia., bears N. $42\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$ W.,
227 lks. dist., marked, T. 16 N R 68 E S 36 BT SC

This corner is on the summit of a long spur, that falls
South.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, 4th rate, very rocky limestone cliffs and ledges.

Timber, scattered growth of pine and juniper.

Undergrowth, mountain mahogany and service berry bushes.


Survey of the south boundary of T. 15 N., R. 68 E.
