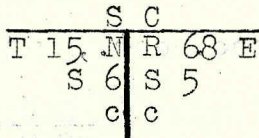


Subdivisions of T. 15 N., R. 68 E.

Chains

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. in dia., 24 ins. in ground, for closing corner of secs. 5 and 6, with brass cap marked,



1918 ; raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 1½ ft. high, S. of cor.

Land, rolling plain.
Soil, 4th rate, very rocky, sandy gravel and boulders.
Timber, none.
Undergrowth, low sagebrush.

This township, lying as it does on the summit of the Snake Mountains, is very rough and broken. Entering the township on the south boundary of sec. 31, the summit traverses thru secs. 31, 30, 29, 28, 27, 22, 15, 14, 11, 10, 2 and 3, leaving on the north boundary of sec. 3.
