79.86 The reconstructed cor. of Ts.8 and 9 N., Rs. 27 and 28 E.

Land, rolling and broken; Soil, gravel, 3rd. rate; Timber, none; Undergrowth, sage brush.

## Survey of the N. boundary of T.9 N., R. 28 E.

From distances obtained from the Survey of the E.

boundary and the Resurvey of the S. and W. boundary,

by calculations I find the N. boundary would be out

of limits if run on random, so survey a true line.

From the cor. of Tps. 9 and 10 N., Rs. 28 and 29 E.

West, on N. boundary of sec. 1.

Asc. 437 ft. over open NE. slope.

1.90 Dry gulch, course S.75°E.

9.70 Dry gulch, course NE. Thence over SE. slope.

19.50 Spur, slopes NE. Thence along broken N. slope.

35.80 Begin desc. of 326 ft. over SW. slope.
