Chains From the cor. of T's.8 and 9 N., R's. 28 and 29 E.,  
hereinafter described I retrace East, on the S. bdy.  
of sec. 31.  
40.00 Fall 12 lks. N. of the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. for secs. 6 and 31,  
hereinafter described. The course of the half mile  
is S.89°50'E., and the distance is 40.00 chs.  
From the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. for secs. 6 and 31., with contin-  
uous chaining east on the S. Bdy. of sec. 31.  
80.00 After diligent search, I find no trace of the cor.  
of secs. 5, 6, 31 and 32.  
Set temp. point for cor. of secs. 5, 6, 31 and 32.  
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From the temp. point for the cor. of secs. 5, 6, 31  
and 32, East on the S. bdy. of sec. 32.  
40.00 Unable to find any trace of the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. for secs.  
5 and 32. Set temp. point.  
80.00 After diligent search, I find no trace of the cor. of  
secs. 4, 5, 32, and 33.  
Set temp. point for the cor. of secs. 4, 5, 32 and 33.  
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From the temp. point for the cor. of secs. 4, 5, 32  
and 33, East on the south bdy. of sec. 33.  
40.00 Unable to find any trace of the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. for secs.  
4 and 33.  
63.40 After diligent search, I find no trace of the cor. of  
fractional secs. 4 and 33.
