The theoretical point for the SE-SW $\frac{1}{64}$ cor. of sec. 23, falls in channel of Walker river. This point being identical with the SE. cor. of allotment No. 108, I therefor run from this point N. 10° 05' W., on a true line, on E. bdy. of allotment No. 108.

1.60 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. dia., 26 ins. in the ground, for witness cor. to SE. cor. of allotment No. 108, with brass cap mkd.

20.01 Intersect the NE. cor. of allotment No. 108, identical with the SE. cor. of allotment No. 107, the place of beginning.

Survey of Indian Allotment No. 493:

Allotment No. 493 to Edna Foster, Trust Patent.

N $\frac{1}{2}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of sec. 26, T. 13 N., R. 28 E.

Beginning at the original NW. cor. of allotment No. 334, established by an allotting Agent of the Indian Office which I find to be a redwood stake, 2 ins. sq., 14 ins. above the ground, firmly set, under wire fence, which bears N. and S., dimly mkd. 5 on NW. and SW. and 334 on SE. faces. No other markings legible. This cor. being further identical with the theoretical point for the C-N $\frac{1}{64}$ cor. of secs. 26, and the SW. cor. of allotment No. 493; therefore alongside this stake, Set an iron post, 3 ft., long, 1 in. dia., 26 ins. in the ground, for the SW. cor. of allotment No. 493, identical with the NW. cor. of allotment No. 334, on E. bdy. of allotment No. 5, with brass cap mkd.
