

## Investigation Survey of T. 33 N., R. 34 E.

## Chains

- From the Temp. point, for the cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36.  
No 0°22'W on blank line.
- 46.84 Intersect N. boundary of T. 33 N., R. 34 E., as surveyed by Criss in 1901, S. 89°50'W., 23.87 chs. dist. from the Township cor., which is a slate rock 8 x 6 x 6 ins. above ground, marked and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General; and N. 89°50'E., 16.61 chs. dist. from the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. which is a Volcanic rock 12 x 8 x 4 ins. above ground, marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  on N. face, surrounded by mound of stone.
- From the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. on the S. bdy of sec. 36 T. 34 N., R. 34 E., I retrace W. on S. bdy of sec. 36.
- 40.60 Fall 15 lks. N. of the cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36, which is a volcanic stone, 24 x 18 x 12 ins. marked and witnessed as described by the Surveyor general.
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- From the cor. of secs. 1, 2, 11 and 12.  
West on retracement, between secs. 2 and 11.
- 40.05 Recorded distance, no trace of the old  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor.
- 80.10 Recorded distance, after diligent search I was unable to find any trace the old cor. of secs. 2, 3, 10 and 11.  
Set temp. point.
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8. Dnc
- From the temp. point, for the cor. of secs. 2, 3, 10 and 11.  
West on retracement, between secs. 3 and 10.
- 41.13 Fall 1.50 chs. N. of the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of secs. 3 and 10 which is a willow stake with squared edges.
- From the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of secs. 3 and 10 the cor. of secs. 2, 3, 10 and 11, set by Criss in 1901 which is a slate stone, 18 x 12 x 6 ins. surrounded by mound of stone, marked and witnessed as described by Surveyor General, bears N. 19°37'W., 49.81 chs. dist.
- From the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of secs. 3 and 10 West on retracement between secs. 3 and 10.
