T. 34 N., R. 34 E., Criss Survey, 1901.

Cor. of Tps. 33&34 N., Rs. 34&35 E. Slate rock, 6x8x6 inches above ground, marked and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General.

$\frac{1}{4}$ cor. of sec. 36. Basalt rock, 4x8x12 inches above ground, mkd $\frac{1}{4}$ on N. face, set in mound of stone.

Cor. of secs. 35 & 36. Basalt rock, 8x10x24 inches set in mound of stone, mkd 1 notch on E and 5 notches on W.

$\frac{1}{4}$ cor. of secs. 35. Basalt rock, 10x12x16 inches in mound of stone, mkd $\frac{1}{4}$ on N. face.

Cor. of secs. 34 & 35. Basalt rock, 8x12x16 inches in mound of stone, mkd 2 notches on E. and 4 notches on W.

Ties to the "Fifty-six" lode claim, M.S.No.40, are shown in section 27, T.33 N., R.33 E.
