

## INVESTIGATION SURVEY, GROUP 69, NEVADA.

$\frac{1}{4}$  Secs. 2 and 3. No trace of the original Dyer Cor.

The cor, established by Deputy Maxson in 1893 is a granite stone, 22x10x8 ins. in a mound of stone, mkd.

" $\frac{1}{4}$ " on W. face.

C.C. of secs. 2 and 3. No trace of original cor. set by Dyer. C.C. established by Deputy Maxson is a redwood stake, 5x5x30 ins. above ground, firmly set and showing scribe marks distinctly on S. face, "CC".

The field notes record this corner as being a stone, 20x19x11 ins., mkd CC and 4 notches on W. face and 2 notches on E. face. Diligent search was made in this locality for a stone answering this description but none was found. I am of the opinion that the redwood stake above described is the authentic CC of secs. 2 and 3 as established in 1893 as its appearance agrees with other corners of this type found south of this point.

C.C. of secs. 1 and 2. A quartzite stone, 18x10x4 ins. in mound of stone, mkd. 5 notches on W. edge, 1 on E. edge and "CC" on S. face. This corner is reported as being a wooden post, 4 ins. square and 4 ft. long.

$\frac{1}{4}$  Secs. 1 and 2. No marked stone was found at this point but a mound of stone which is evidently the monument for the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of secs. 1 and 2.

Cor. of secs. 1, 2, 11 and 12. A basalt rock, 20x15x3 ins. in a mound of stone, mkd. 5 notches on S. face and 1 notch on E.

Cor. of secs. 1 and 12 on E. bdy. of T. 31 N., R. 33 E. By Deputy Maxson in 1893.

A slate rock, 20x10x4 ins. in a mound of stone, mkd. 1 groove on N. face and 5 grooved on S. face.

By Deputy Criss in 1901.

A rhyolite rock, 20x12x6 ins. in a mound of stone, mkd. 1 notch on N. edge and 5 notches on S. edge.

This corner is referred to in Special Agent Doyle's report.

$\frac{1}{4}$  Sec. 12. A rhyolite rock, 24x14x6 ins. in a mound of stone, no marks on rock. This rock appears to have been carefully placed upright in the center of the mound and as this rock agrees in dimensions with the
