

GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

These sections lie on high, rough mountainous land, the general drainage of which is north-westerly into Humboldt creek, the waters of which are diverted into a pipe line leading to the Southern Pacific Railroad at Humboldt Station, about 4 miles distant. The north-eastern portion of section 6 drains north-easterly. The ruins of former Humboldt City are situated along the banks of Humboldt Creek in section 1, T. 31 N., R. 33 E.

Scattering to medium dense stands of juniper timber are to be found on the north and east slopes. The soil is very rocky.

There are numerous indications of mineral thruout the sections.
