

Dependent Resurvey of the Nevada-Utah State Line.

Chains. a cedar 5 ins. in dia., bears N. $69\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W., 165 lks., dist., marked T 12 N R 70 E S 36 B T
Land, rolling. Soil, sandy and gravelly. Undergrowth, medium growth shadscale. Timber, a few scattering scrub cedar.

Independent Resurvey of one mile of the Second Standard Parallel North.

The standard township cor. of T. 11 N., R's. 70 and 71 E. is a 3 in. iron post, marked and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General. I destroy all accessories and mark L P thereon.

The standard cor. of secs 31 and 32 is a pine post, 3 ins. by 3 ins., 3 ft. above ground, firmly set in a mound of earth and stone and marked and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General. Alongside set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. in dia., 18 ins. in the ground, supported by a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 18 ins. high, for the standard cor. of secs. 31 and 32, with brass cap mkd.

a pinion pine 5 ins. in dia., bears N. $45\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E., 31 lks. dist., marked S C T 11 N R 70 E S 32 B T

a pinion pine 8 ins. in dia., bears N. $46\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W., 59 lks. dist., marked S C T 11 N R 70 E S 31 B T

West, on a true line, on the Second Standard Parallel N., along the S. Bdy. of sec. 31.

Over rough mountainous land, through dense pinion pine timber and mahogany brush.

Ascend.

10.30 Base of perpendicular ledge, 20 ft. high, 370 ft. above sec. cor., bears S.

14.90 Top of rocky spur, 332 ft. above ledge, bears S.

23.60 Top of spur, 77 ft. above spur, bears S.E.

34.00 Dry wash, 71 ft. below spur, course S.

37.40 Top of spur, 65 ft. above draw, bears S.

40.00 After diligent search fail to find any traces of the old standard $\frac{1}{2}$ sec. cor.

True point for the standard $\frac{1}{2}$ sec. cor. for sec. 31 falls on ledge, 24 ft. below spur. Impracticable to set cor. at this point.

40.30 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. in dia., 8 ins. in the ground, supported by a mound of stone, 3 ft. base,
