Chains.

- 6.60 Main road, Baker to Garrison, bears S.E. and N.W.
 18.56 Set temp. point for the cor. of T's. 12 and 13 N., R. 70 E.
 Land, nearly level. Soil, sandy and gravelly; 3rd rate.
 Undergrowth, medium growth of shadscale and sage. Timber,
 none.
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Dependent Resurvey of the S. Bdy. of T. 13 N., R. 70 E.

The old cor. of T's. 12 and 13 N., R's. 69 and 70 E. is
 a quartzite stone, 12 x 10 x 10 ins. above ground, marked
 as described by the Surveyor General.

I destroy all markings referring to T. 12 N. and alongside,
 set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. in dia., 6 ins. in
 the ground, in a mound of stone, 5 ft. base, 30 ins.
 high, for the cor. of T. 13 N., R's. 69 and 70 E., with
 brass cap mkd.
