

RETRACEMENT AND DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF THE WEST BOUNDARY T.20N., R.44 & 45 E.

CHAINS

77.90 Draw, 290 ft. below ridge, drains.W.; ascend.

97.09 Intersect the closing cor. of T.20.N.,Rs. 44 and 45 E.  
which is a limestone, 5 x 8 x 7 ins. above ground,  
firmly set, and marked and witnessed as described by  
the surveyor general.

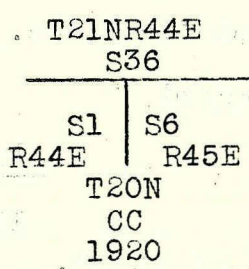
I destroy marks on this stone and leave same standing in  
place.

Continue, N.0°08'W. to

97.14 Intersect 4th. Standard Parallel North 6.24 chs. west  
of the standard cor. of T.21 N., Rs. 44 and 45 E.  
heretofore described.

At point of intersection,

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. in dia., 24 ins. in  
the ground for closing cor. of T.20 N., Rs. 44 and 45  
E., with brass cap marked



Raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 1½ ft. high, S. of  
cor.

Land, mountainous; drainage W.

Soil, sandy and rocky of granite formation.

No timber.

Undergrowth, dense sage and yellow top brush.
