78.60	Fall 77 lks. E. of the cor. of secs. 19, 24, 25 and 30, hereinafter described. The course of this line is N. 0° 34'W., and the distance is 78.60 chs.
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	From the cor. of secs. 19, 24, 25 and 30. North, on retracement, searching for original corners at record distances, none of which were found until at
324.77	Fall 6.61 chs. W. of the orig. cor. of Ts. 44 and 45 N., Rs. 52 and 53 E., which is the decayed fragment of an old stake about 8 ins. in length and projecting about 1 in. above the surface. This old cor. is in the center of a low mound of earth covered with thickly-matted sod and stands in a small clearing among dense sage- brush undergrowth. Retracement west from this cor. checked topography very closely with the original "call." To restore the Tp. cor., I set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, for the cor. of Ts. 45 and 44 N., R. 52 E., with brass cap mkd:
