DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF A PORTION OF THE EAST BOUNDARY OF T. 43 N., R. 52 EAST

From the closing cor. of Ts. 43 and 44 N., R. 53 E., previously described,

N. 0° 18' W., on true line, along E. bdy. of sec. 1, T. 43 N., R. 52 E.,

Over rough mountainous land thru scattering undergrowth.

3.90 Rocky spur, 20 ft. above cor., slopes N. 80° E. 5 chs. thence SE., desc. 140 ft. over rocky N. slope.

11.00 Head of small ravine, drains E., asc. 100 ft. over S. slope.

16.87 The orig. cor. of Ts. 43 and 44 N., R. 52 E., which is a granite stone, 16x8x4 ins. in a mound of stone, mkd. and witnessed as described by the surveyor general. Alongside and to the north of orig. cor. stone, set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. diam., 20 ins. in the ground to bedrock, in a mound of stone, with brass cap mkd:
