

SURVEY OF THE EAST BDY. OF T. 45 N., R. 53 E.

Chains

"Pile of Rocks".

35.40 East point of "Pile of Rocks", desc. slightly over rocky SE. slope.

38.26 Intersect Old Ninth Standard Parallel North, S. 89° 22' W., 1.95 chs. distant from the Std. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 36 as hereinbefore described.

At point of intersection, set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, for the closing cor. of T. 45 N., Rs. 53 and 54 E., with brass cap mkd:

and raise a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 2 ft. high, S. of cor.

From cor.,

A cross (x) and "BO T45NR53E S1" on N. face of granite boulder, 10x10x12 ft., bears S. 7° W., 237 lks. distant.

Mouth of tunnel bears S. 9° E., 12.50 chs. distant.

SE. cor. of mill bears S. 2° 12' E.

Land, mountainous,

Soil, gravelly and rocky, shallow loam, 2nd and 3rd rate.

Limestone formation and subsoil.

Undergrowth, sagebrush, buck brush, willows, service berry.

No timber, Good grazing. NW. exposure and W. drainage.
