

SURVEY OF THE WEST BDY. OF T. 45 N., R. 53 E.

CHAINS

80.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 26 ins. in the ground, for cor. of secs. 6 and 7 only, with brass cap mkd:

T45N

R53E

S 6

S 7

1921

no suitable bearing trees available, raise a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 2 ft. high, E. of cor.

Land, South $\frac{3}{4}$ mile; rolling. North $\frac{1}{4}$ mile, mountainous.

Soil, gravelly and rocky, shallow loam, coarse texture, rocky subsoil, basaltic formation, 3rd rate.

Undergrowth, manzanita, willows, sagebrush, service berry.

Timber, aspen, scattering balsam fir.

Good grazing.

Northern exposure. Northeastern drainage.

North, along West bdy. of sec. 6,

Over mountainous land thru dense undergrowth and clumps of dense scrub aspen. Desc. 30 ft. over broken W. slope.

8.00 Head of draw, drains W., asc. 40 ft. over S. slope, thru very dense service berry undergrowth.

19.70 Spur, projects W., desc. over rocky NW. slope.

40.00 On gentle NW. slope covered with dense service berry and sagebrush, 120 ft. below spur,

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 20 ins. in the ground to solid rock, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 6 only, with brass cap mkd:

and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, E. of cor.
