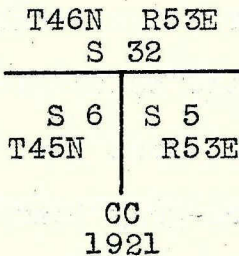


Subdivision of T. 45 N., R. 53 E.

CHAINS

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 12 ins. in the ground to solid rock, and 20 ins. in a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, for closing cor. of secs. 5 and 6, with brass cap mkd:



and deposit a basaltic stone, 8x8x12 ins., mkd. with a cross (x) on top surface, at base of mound and along side of post.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, shallow gravelly and rocky loam, medium to coarse texture, rocky subsoil, basaltic and limestone formation, 2nd and 3rd rate.

Undergrowth, manzanita, service berry, sagebrush, buck brush, willows, cherry.

Timber, aspen.

Good grazing.

General Description.

This township is entirely mountainous; the highest range at an approximate elevation of 8500 feet lies in the extreme southwestern portion and extends in a general northerly direction.. From this main ridge, smaller ridges extend in a general easterly direction practically to the
