

General Description.

The land in this township is nearly all rolling mountainous. The south half of the township is covered with a dense growth of pinon pine and cedar timber, and the north half with a scattering growth of cedar, pinon pine and mahogany. The soil is generally a rocky clay loam covered with a good growth of bunch grass and black sage.

The only water in the township is located in the eastern portion of secs. 12 and 13. The land is valuable chiefly as winter grazing land for sheep.

Surface indications of copper were observed in the southern part of the township.

A State highway traverses the township in a north westerly and south easterly direction through secs. 15, 16, 17, 18, 22, 23, 26, 35 and 36. At the time of this survey the road was graded and graveled from Ely, Nevada to the summit of a ridge in sec. 22, a distance of approximately twenty miles.

There was one settler located in sec. 12^{and 13} at the time of this survey.
