General Description

This township is located approximately seventeen miles southeast of Tippett, Nevada, at an elevation of approximately 7500 ft. The land is rough mountainous, and is covered with pinon pine, cedar, mahogany and fir timber. The soil is generally a dark, rocky clay loam. The formation is principally limestone.

The township is well watered by numerous small springs and owing to the short seasons and heavy snow fall is valuable chiefly as summer grazing land for stock.

There were two settlers residing in the township at the time of this survey, Wade H. Parrish in secs. 16 and 17 and Lewis Symonds in secs. 7 and 8.

Surface indications of copper were observed in sec. 33.
