- Deposit a small stone, marked (X) at base of cor.
- 45.50 Ravine, 80 ft. below ¼ sec. cor., course W., asc. 70 ft. over rocky S. slope.
- 49.60 Top of S. edge of table land, bears E. and W., thence over nearly level table land.
- 60.70 Top and N. edge of table land, bears E. and W., desc. 100 ft. over NW. slope.
- 72.20 Gulch, course W., asc. 120 ft. over S. slope.
- 83.50 Spur, slopes NW., desc. 70 ft. over gradual N. slope.
- 114.97 Intersect the S. Bdy. of T. 39 N., R. 24 E., at a point, 21.55 chs. E. of the cor. of Tps., 39 N., Rs. 23 and 24 E., which is a lava stone, 8x8x8 ins., above the ground, firmly set, marked and witnessed as described by the surveyor general. At the point of intersection, Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. dia., 16 ins. in the ground to bed rock and 8 ins. in a mound of stone, for cor. of Tps. 38 N., Rs. 23½ and 24 E., with brass cap mkd.
