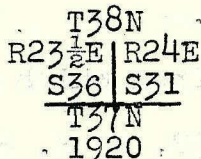


Chains

N. of cor.

- 51.75 Dry gulch, course NW., 60 ft. below $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.
- 77.95 Dim road, bears N. and S.
- 78.74 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. dia., 24 ins. in the ground, for cor. of Ts. 37 and 38 N., Rs. 23 $\frac{1}{2}$ and 24 E., with brass cap mkd.



and raise a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, S. of cor.

Land, rough mountainous and rolling. Soil, light sandy gravelly clay loam, medium texture, dry and shallow; very rocky. Undergrowth, sagebrush and a fair growth of bunch grass.

Note:

In order to establish the East and North boundaries of T. 38 N., R. 24 E. and make proper connections with the SW. cor. of T. 39 N., R. 25 E., it was necessary to retrace certain exterior lines of T. 39 N., R. 25 E. and to restore the SW. cor. of T. 39 N., R. 25 E. as follows:

The cor. of secs. 25, 30, 31 and 36, on W. Bdy. of T. 39 N., R. 25 E., which is described in the original field notes as being a charred post in a mound with pits; I find same cor. to be a lava stone, 14x12x8 ins., firmly set in a mound of stone and marked on upturned face with 1 groove toward S. 5 grooves toward N. and 6 grooves each toward E. and W. edges of this upturned face. Thence from this cor.

Retraced south, bet. secs. 31 and 36.

- 40.00 After a diligent search, failed to find any trace of the original $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

- 80.00 All traces of the original cor. of tps. 38 and 39 N.,
