

## RETRACEMENT OF THE FOURTH STD. PAR. S. THRU RANGES 48 &amp; 49 E.

## CHAINS

From the Std. closing cor. of sec. 36, T.16 S., R.48 E., which is a granite stone, 10x12x8 ins. above ground, firmly set in a slight mound of earth, no marks on stone but traces of pits are discernible.

East, on retracement, along S. bdy. of sec. 36.

Over level desert land thru scattering undergrowth,

36.05 No trace of orig. Std.  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of sec. 36

76.05 No trace of orig. Std. cor. of Ts. 16 N., Rs. 48 and 49 E.

76.22 Set temp. Std. Tp. cor.

Thence,

East, on retracement along S. bdy. of sec. 31, with continuous measurement,

91.61 Remains of old wooden stake, 1x2 ins. by 2 ft. in length, mkd. 6 notches on SE. and SW. edges, S1 on S. face, Rg.48E on W. face, Rg 49E on N. face, S6 on E. face, lying on surface of ground, bears N. 4 lks. distant. This point is not accepted as the true position of the closing corner of secs. 1 and 6.

116.31 Fall 30 lks. S. of the Std.  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of sec. 31, which is hereinafter described.

The true course of this line is S.89° 51' W., and the proportionate length of the E. half mile is 40.09 chs.

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From the orig. Std.  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of sec. 31,

East, on retracement,

40.17 Fall 12 lks. N. of the orig. Std. cor. of secs. 31 and 32 hereinafter described. The true course of this line is N.89°50' W., and the length is 40.17 chs.

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From orig. Std. cor. of secs. 31 and 32.

East, on retracement,

13.15 Fall 2 lks. N. of the orig. closing cor. of secs. 5 and 6, hereinafter described.

East, with continuous measurement and same line,
