CHAINS

aspen timber, bears N. and S.

83.58 The cor. of Ts. 46 and 47 N., Rs. 59 and 60 E., herein-  
before described.

Land, mountainous. General N. drainage.

Soil, shallow gravelly and rocky loam, basaltic form-  
ation, 2nd and 3rd rate.

Undergrowth, sagebrush, service berry, manzanita, buck  
brush.

Timber, aspen, scattering balsam fir in bottom.

Excellent grazing.

Subdivision of T. 47 N., R. 59 E.

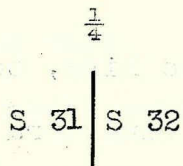
From the cor. of secs. 31 and 32, <sup>on South Bdy. of Tp.</sup> previously described,  
N.0°01'E., on true line, bet. secs. 31 and 32  
Over mountainous land thru scattering undergrowth. Asc.  
along W. slope.

.13 Forest Reserve fence, bears E. and W.

14.60 Small rocky spur, 50 ft. above cor., projects W., a small  
natural pond, approximately 1 acre in area, bears  
N.64 $\frac{1}{4}$ °W., 13 chains distant. Desc. along rocky NW.  
slope.

22.60 Rocky spur ridge, bears N.20°W. and S.20°E., desc. over  
broken NE. slope.

40.00 On E. slope, 150 ft. below ridge,  
Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 26 ins. in  
the ground, for  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of secs. 31 and 32, with  
brass cap mkd:



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and raise a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 2 ft. high,  
W. of cor.

44.30 Spur, projects NE., desc. NW. slope.

53.60 Slope changes to abrupt N., desc. thru dense undergrowth  
and scattering clumps of heavy scrub aspen timber.

65.50 Trail, bears NE. to Robinson Hole and SW. to Jarbidge.
