GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

The lands in fractional T. 8 N., R. 29 E. are generally mountainous in character. Parts of sections 1, 2, 12, 13 and 24 being slightly rolling to level. Some arable ground is found along Walker Lake in Section 1, SE $\frac{1}{4}$  section 2, NE $\frac{1}{4}$  section 11, E $\frac{1}{2}$  section 12, SE $\frac{1}{4}$  section 13, and NE $\frac{1}{4}$  section 24. Extensive improvements have been made by G. B. Stannard in sections 13 and 24, while Emil Anderson has about 5 acres under cultivation in sections 2 and 11.

The private claim in section 24 has no improvements and the present owner has made no attempt to locate his corners. There are no original corners within reach to identify the claim.

That land subject to cultivation produces excellent crops of alfalfa hay and garden truck. Water for all purposes is obtained from Cat and House Creeks.

The soil is generally a coarse sandy loam in the lowlands, while the uplands contain much gravelly and rocky formations.

The general drainage of the township is northeasterly into Walker Lake.

Hawthorne, Nevada, the County seat of Mineral County is situated about 3 miles east of the corners of secs. 24 and 25 on the east boundary of the township.
