General Description of T. 28 N., R. 24 E.

The character of the land in sec. 1, E. $\frac{1}{2}$ sec.2, W. $\frac{1}{2}$ sec. 9, E. $\frac{1}{2}$ sec.11, secs. 12 and 13, E. $\frac{1}{2}$ sec.14, sec.16, W. $\frac{1}{2}$ sec. 22, E. $\frac{1}{2}$ sec. 23, sec. 24, N. $\frac{1}{2}$ sec. 25, W. $\frac{1}{2}$ sec. 27 is rolling mountainous.

While that in the W. $\frac{1}{2}$ sec.2, secs. 3 and 4, E. $\frac{1}{2}$ sec.9, sec.10, W. $\frac{1}{2}$ sec. 11, W. $\frac{1}{2}$ sec. 14, sec.15, E. $\frac{1}{2}$ sec. 22, S. $\frac{1}{2}$ sec. 25, sec. 26, E. $\frac{1}{2}$ sec. 27, SE $\frac{1}{4}$ sec.33, S. $\frac{1}{2}$ sec. 34, secs. 35 and sec. 36, is rough mountainous. In secs. 2, 3, and 4 it is extremely rough. These 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ miles along the N. boundary cross a high rocky spur ridge locally named Limbo mountain, with very steep slopes covered with
