General Description.

The character of the land covered by tract No. 37 and the adjusted entries in secs. 19, 20 and 30, is rough mountainous. The soil is of a fine black damp sandy clay loam. The whole section is covered by a dense heavy growth of sagebrush and a fair growth of bunch grass. Pass Creek, traverses nearly through the center of tract No. 37 in an easterly direction.
