Land, rough broken mountainous. Soil, light shallow sandy clay loam, very rocky with cliffs sliderocks and volcanic/outcroppings, 3rd rate. Vegetation, sagebrush and a fair growth of bunchgrass. Small groves of aspen timber in bottom of ravines.
