44.64 The original $\frac{1}{4}$ cor. of secs. 2 and 35, which is a volcanic stone, 6x10x14 ins., firmly set in a mound of stone, mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ on N. face. witnessed by a mound of stone, N. of cor. As this cor. is in a good state of preservation, I do not change its construction. This cor. will hereafter serve for the $\frac{1}{4}$ cor. for sec. 35, T. 38 N., R. 19 E. only, therefore additionally mark S 35 on N. face. I now change my course to S. 89° 37' W., and continue on true line on N. Bdy. of sec. 2, with continuous measurement.

49.40 W. edge of rimrock of table land, bears N. and S.; thence desc. 590 ft. over broken rocky SW. slope to

84.63 The original cor. of secs. 2, 3, 34 and 35, which is a volcanic stone, 8x10x14 ins., firmly set in a mound of stone, mkd. with 2 notches on E. and 4 notches on W. edges, witnessed by a mound of stone, W. of cor. As this cor. is in a state of perfect preservation, I do not change its construction.

Land, mountainous and nearly level table land.

Soil, light shallow sandy clay loam, 3rd rate. Many volcanic outcroppings and sliderock on steep slopes and a blanket of flat volcanic rocks on top of table land.

Vegetation, small scrub sagebrush and a fair growth of bunchgrass.
