Land, rough mountainous. Soil, alluvial light sandy loam very shallow and decomposed granite, with many granite and volcanic rock outcroppings and loose boulders on surface. Undergrowth, sagebrush, and a fair growth of nutritious grasses. No timber.

Dependent Resurvey of a Portion of Subdivisions of
T. 42 N., R. 28 E.

From the reestablished cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36, on the S. bdy. of the Tp., heretofore described. N. 3° 02' W., on a true line, bet. secs. 35 and 36. Asc. gradually over rolling land, through dense undergrowth.

- 9.25 Wire fence, bears N. 52° E. and S. 52° W.
- 14.60 Main road, from Leonard Creek to Piute Meadows, bears NE. and SW.
- 16.10 Dim road, bears E. and W.
- 22.00 Point of low spur, projects N. 70° E.
Leave rolling land, enter rolling mountainous, bears NE. and SW. asc. 70 ft. to
- 40.06 A point, which has a northing of 40.00 chs. from the cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36, on the S. bdy. of the Tp. at which point,
Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. dia., 6 ins. in the ground to solid rock and 20 ins. in a mound of stone, for $\frac{1}{4}$ cor. of sec. 35, with brass cap mkd.
