

● Dependent Resurvey of a Portion of Subdivisions of T. 42 N., R. 28 E. 51

Chains

$\frac{1}{4}$  cor. of secs. 1 and 2.

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. dia., 26 ins. in the ground, for  $\frac{1}{4}$  cor. of secs. 1 and 2, with brass cap mkd.

and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  ft. high, W. of cor. Thence desc. 15 ft. to

45.70 Snow Creek, 10 lks. wide, clear water, over rocky and gravelly bottom, 8 ins. deep, fringed with willow, alder and aspen brush, course S. 20° E.

Thence along bottom of creek.

49.20 Leave Snow Creek, from N. 10° W.; thence asc. 60 ft. to

52.65 Trail, bears N. 20° W. and S. 10° E., traversing along edge of creek. Thence asc. abruptly over broken rocky SW. slope 795 ft. to

84.57 Intersect the reestablished cor. of secs. 1 and 2, on the N. bdy. of the Tp., heretofore described.

Land, rolling mountainous and rough mountainous. Soil, light sandy clay and gravel loam, shallow, much volcanic rock outcropping and sliderock. Undergrowth, sagebrush and a fair growth of bunch grass. Several large groves of aspen timber along NE. slopes in sec. 2, and along Snow Creek.

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Subdivisions T. 42 N., R. 28 E.

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From the cor. of secs. 34 and 35, on the S. bdy. of the Tp. heretofore described.

N. 0° 09' W., on a true line, bet. secs. 34 and 35.

Over rolling land, through dense undergrowth, asc. gradually.

31.10 Dry wash, 20 lks. wide, gravel bottom, with perpendicular banks 2 ft. high, course SE.; asc. gradually.

40.62 A point determined through operation hereinafter recorded
