General Description

The northern and western portions of this township, comprising sections 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 17, 18, 19, 30 and 31, is rolling mountainous land, covered with a medium growth of black sage and scattering bunch grass.

The remainder of the township is nearly level land covered with a medium growth of black sage and shadscale and a scant growth of bunch grass. The soil, generally, is a very rocky, sandy clay loam of medium texture.

Although the soil is capable of producing good crops with irrigation, the land is valuable chiefly as winter grazing land for sheep.

Trout Creek traverses the township in a S. Easterly direction through sections 5, 8, 16, 17 and 21. Pole

Creek traverses the township in a southeasterly direction through sections 6, 7 and 8. There is a good stream of running water in these creeks for approximately eight months of the year. Approximately twenty acres of land
