

Independent Resurvey of the E. Bdy. of T. 13 S., R. 47 E.

Chains. North; on a true line; bet. secs. 1 and 6.

Ascend along broken S.W. slope of ridge.

38.20 East 3.36 chs. dist: set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. in dia., 8 ins. in the ground, to bed rock, for the witness $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap mkd.

The cor. stands on top of ridge, which bears N.W. and S.E., 760 ft. above sec cor.

40.00 True point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. falls on ledge and owing to slide rock and a series of small vertical ledges no secure place, on line, within a distance of 10.00 chs.

from the true point can be found to set the cor.

48.00 No trace of old $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor could be found.

Canyon, 400 ft. below ridge, course E.

79.00 Top of spur ridge, 500 ft. above canyon, projects N.E.

80.25 Intersect N. bdy. of twp., at a point S. 89° 47' W., 12.72 chs. dist. from the Stand cor. of T. 12 S., R's. 47 and 48 E., hereinbefore described.

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. in dia., 6 ins. in the ground, in a mound of stone, for the closing cor. of T. 13 S., R's. 47 and 48 E., with brass cap mkd.
