

GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

The greater part of the township is made up of rolling bench land, the only mountainous area being in the extreme SW. corner.

The small mountainous area is thickly covered with fragmentary lava and occasional outcroppings.

There are two distinct types of soil in the township. In the higher elevations is found disintegrated lava, and as the ground slopes towards the lowlands, the soil becomes finer and sandy.

No timber is found within the township.

The predominant types of undergrowth are, sagebrush and shadscale, there being some yellow top in the bottoms.

So far as can be learned, no mineral of any type of value, has been found in the township.

The township is devoid of water, except during the freshet season. There are no settlers in the township, and the land is unsuited to any kind of profitable pursuit, except stockraising.

The nearest postoffice is Austin, Nevada, the county seat of Lander County, which is located about 26 miles by road in a westerly direction.
