

Survey of the South Boundary of T. 25 N., R. 47 E.

Chains	A juniper, 10 ins. diam., bears N.52°W., 54 lks. distant, mkd: T25N R47E S31 BT Land, mountainous and broken. Soil, shallow gravelly and rocky clay loam, 3rd rate. Undergrowth, sagebrush, yellow top. Timber, juniper. Fair grazing.
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	West, bet. secs. 6 and 31, Over broken and rolling land thru dense undergrowth and scattering juniper timber. Asc. SE. slope.
2.80	Spur, 10 ft. above sec. cor., projects S.40°W., desc. over rocky W. slope, 70 ft.
8.60	Draw, drains S.30°W., asc. E. slope.
12.50	Spur, 60 ft. above draw, projects S.30°W., continue over S. slope.
17.00	Low spur, projects S.30°W., desc. W. slope.
22.60	Draw, 60 ft. below spur, drains S., asc. E. slope.
27.00	Spur, 90 ft. above draw, projects S., desc. W. slope.
32.60	Base of abrupt W. slope, 100 ft. below spur. Continue over gentle S. slope.
36.00	Shallow wash in main draw, drains S.10°E.
38.03	Old wood road, bears S.10°E. and N.10°W.
40.00	On level bottom land in very dense undergrowth, Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 26 ins. in the ground, for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 6 and 31, with brass cap mkd:

52.75	Fall 147 lks. N. of the old cor. of Ts. 24 and 25 N., Rs. 46 and 47 E., which is a juniper stake, 2 ins. square and 3 ft. long with scribe marks visible on two faces, set in a mound of earth and stone. I destroy
