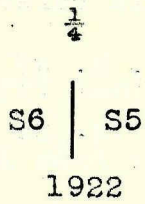


Subdivision of T. 25 N., R. 47 E.

Chains



from which,

A small spring (previously noted at 14.90 chs.) bears N.80°E.

Continue ascent of rocky S. slope.

54.00 Ridge, 210 ft. above  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor., bears E. and W., desc. over broken N. slope thru heavy timber, bears E. and W.

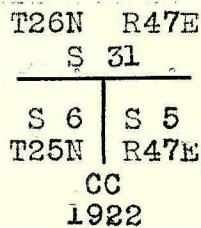
60.30 Head of small draw, 225 ft. below ridge, drains N.30°W., Desc. 330 ft. along steep, rocky NW. slope.

83.60 Draw, drains N.15°E., continue along steep E. slope thru heavy timber.

90.35 Intersect Fifth Std. Par. N., East, 2.44 chs. distant from the Std.  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of sec. 31, as described in Book "A", T. 26 N., R. 47 E.

At point of intersection,

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 18 ins. in the ground to solid rock and 12 ins. in a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, for the closing cor. of secs. 5 and 6, with brass cap mkd:



from which,

A pinon pine, 8 ins. diam., bears S.11 $\frac{1}{2}$ °E., 50 lks. distant, mkd: T25N R47E S5 CC BT ✓

A pinon pine, 6 ins. diam., bears S.22 $\frac{1}{2}$ °W., 58 lks. distant, mkd: T25N R47E S6 CC BT ✓

Land, rough mountainous.

Soil, shallow rocky loam, 3rd and 4th rate.

Undergrowth, sagebrush, buck brush, service berry.

Timber, pinon pine, juniper.

Fair grazing.
