Chains

- 58.10 Ravine, drains W.
- 78.20 Draw, drains N.75°W.
- 80.04 The restored cor. of Ts. 26 and 27 N., Rs. 47 and 48 E.,
heretofore described.
- Land, rolling and broken; general NW. drainage.
- Soil, gravelly and rocky loam, medium to coarse texture,
gravelly subsoil, 2nd to 3rd rate.
- Undergrowth, sagebrush, buck brush.
- Timber, juniper, pinon pine. Poor grazing.

- From the Std. cor. of T. 26 N., Rs. 47 and 48 E.,
heretofore described,
- West, on true line, along S. bdy. of sec. 36,
Over nearly level land thru very dense undergrowth.
- 40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 28 ins. in
the ground, for the Std. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 36, with
brass cap mkd:
